- An extended round may be open if needed. Applicants who missed the main round should check the Graduate School website and Admissions System for updates.\
- Application deadlines are subject to change without prior notice. For the most current information, please refer to the Graduate School website and the Postgraduate Admissions System.

## Chapter 3: Admissions Requirements

---

### 3.1 Research Postgraduate Programmes (MPhil/PhD)

#### **General Entrance Requirements**

To be eligible for admission to the MPhil/PhD programmes, an applicant shall:

1. Hold a relevant bachelor's degree with honours, normally at Second Class Upper division or above, from a recognised university; OR
2. Hold a relevant master's degree from a recognised university.
3. Fulfil the English Language Proficiency Requirement as prescribed by the University, which may be demonstrated by:
  - Obtaining a degree from a university in Hong Kong or an English-speaking country, where the degree was taught primarily in English.; OR
  - A minimum score of 90 in the TOEFL iBT; OR
  - An overall band score of 6.5 in the IELTS.

#### **Programme-Specific Requirements**

##### **MPhil/PhD in Chinese, English, History, Psychology, Sociology, Economics:**

- A Bachelor's degree (for MPhil) or a master's degree (for PhD) in a closely related field is required.
- Applicants should also be able to provide good recommendations from their higher education institutions.
- PhD with a Bachelor's degree awarded First Class honours in a closely related field and graduated from a recognised university may also be considered.

##### **Additional Requirements for All Research Programmes:**

- A compelling research proposal.
- A writing sample (if applicable).
- Strong performance in an interview.

### **3.2 Taught Postgraduate Programmes (MSc/MA/MSSc)**

#### **General Entrance Requirements**

To be eligible for admission to the taught postgraduate programmes, an applicant shall:

1. Hold a relevant bachelor's degree with honours, normally at Second Class Upper division or above, from a recognised university; OR
2. Hold a relevant master's degree from a recognised university.
3. Fulfil the English Language Proficiency Requirement as prescribed by the Programme, which may be demonstrated by:
  - Obtaining a degree from a university in Hong Kong or an English-speaking country where the degree was taught primarily in English; OR
  - A programme-specified score in the TOEFL OR IETLS
4. For programmes taught wholly or partially in Chinese, applicants must demonstrate Chinese language proficiency. This may be verified by a degree from a Chinese-medium institution or a required score in a recognised Chinese language proficiency test.

#### **Additional Requirements for Taught Postgraduate Programmes:**

- Strong performance in an interview.
- Recommendation reports from referees

Some programmes may also require applicants to submit

- A personal statement;
- A research proposal or a writing sample;
- Proof of professional qualifications or membership
- Proof of working experience
- Work portfolio

*Admission requirements are subject to change. Applicants must visit the programme website for the specific requirements prior to application.*

## Chapter 4: Application and Admissions Procedures

---

### 4.1 Online Application

All applications must be submitted online via the HKSU Postgraduate Admission System.

#### Step-by-Step Guide:

1. **Create an Account:** Go to <https://postgraduate-admission.hksyu.edu/en/> and create a new applicant account using your email address.
2. **Start a New Application:** Log in to your account and select "New Application". Choose your intended programme for the 2026-27 academic year.
3. **Fill in the Application Form:** Complete all sections of the form accurately. The form must be completed in **English** unless otherwise stated. Sections include:
  - o Personal Information
  - o Academic Qualifications
  - o Work Experience (if any)
  - o Programme-specific questions (e.g., Research Proposal for RPGs, publications, professional qualifications and memberships, academic activities)
  - o Referee Information
4. **Upload Supporting Documents:** You will be required to upload all necessary documents in the specified format (typically PDF or JPG, no zip files are allowed). Please refer to Section 4.2 for the list of required documents.
5. **Pay the Application Fee:** Settle the non-refundable and non-transferrable application fee online via WeChat Pay, Alipay, FPS, or Credit Card.
6. **Submit and Monitor:** Review your application thoroughly before submission. After submission, you can check your application status in the "My Progress" page through your admission account.

## 4.2 Supporting Documents Required

### Accuracy and Completeness of Documents

Applicants are responsible for providing accurate and complete information and documents for admission purposes. All details given in the application must be true and correct. Making, submitting, or using any false instrument (including forged documents) constitutes a serious criminal offence under the Crimes Ordinance (Cap. 200) of Hong Kong. Any submission of false or misleading information will result in the disqualification of the application and any subsequent admission to Hong Kong Shue Yan University.

### List of Required Documents for Upload

The application form must be completed in English unless otherwise stated. Applicants must prepare and upload the following documents to the Postgraduate Admissions System in the specified format (typically PDF or JPG):

- **A recent, colour, passport-size photo** (approximately 40mm (W) x 50mm (H)) showing a full-frontal face with clear facial features.
- **Copy of your identity documents**, e.g. HKID Card, Passport, Mainland Resident Identity Card, Exit-Entry Permit for Travelling to and from Hong Kong and Macau, etc.
- **Academic Qualifications:**
  - Copy of Graduation Certificate and Degree Certificate.
  - For qualifications from Mainland China: You must also provide the Online Verification Report(s) issued by China Higher Education Student Information (CHSI 學信網).
  - For Mainland Chinese applicants with overseas qualifications: You must provide the Overseas Credential Evaluation Report issued by the Chinese Service Center for Scholarly Exchange (CSCSE) (教育部留學服務中心).
  - Applicants with dual-degree must hold a graduation certificate/testimonial with name of the collaborating institutions.
- **Academic Transcripts:** Copy of official Transcript(s) with a grading scheme from all tertiary institutions attended.
- **Proof of English Proficiency:** Copy of TOEFL/IELTS score report (if applicable).
- **Programme-Specific Documents:**
  - **Curriculum Vitae (CV)** (if any)
  - **Recommendation Letters / Reports from Referee**

- **Others:** Research Proposal, Sample of Writings, Personal Statement, work portfolio (if any)
- **Referee Information:** Please provide valid institutional contact information for your referees (e.g., official university or office email address and telephone number). Personal/non-institutional contact information is not preferred. Please ensure your referees can receive messages sent from Hong Kong. Failure to do so may delay or adversely affect your application.
- **Copy of a valid visa/entry permit** (e.g., IANG, working permit or dependant visa) if currently held.
- **Copies of certificates of professional qualifications or proof of professional membership** (if applicable).

### **Submission of Official Documents**

Applicants are generally required to arrange for the following documents to be sent directly to the University's Admissions Office (Postgraduate Admissions) within one month after submitting their online application:

- **Official transcripts:** Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended, sent in a sealed envelope with an official chop by the issuing institutions. Please use the [Transcript Submission Covering Sheet](#).
- **Official language test score reports:** Must be sent directly by the examination body. Scores are valid for two years from the test date.

However, applicants may need not to mail official documents during the initial application stage. If an application is shortlisted, the Admissions Office will notify the applicant separately to submit the required original documents for verification.

*Important:* Failure to provide the required documents as specified may result in your application being deemed incomplete and will not be processed further.

### 4.3 Verification of Academic Qualifications

HKSU verifies all academic qualifications to ensure their authenticity. The required verification method depends on where you obtained your qualifications.

You may also use the service of assessing individual qualification provided by HKCAAVQ (Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications) to identify and verify your qualifications.</p>

#### 4.4 Offers Issuance

The admissions process involves the following stages.

- **Application Review:** The Graduate School and respective departments will review all complete applications. The review process may take approximately 60 working days.
- **Interview:** Shortlisted applicants will be invited for an interview, which may be conducted in person on campus or online.
- **Issuance of Offer:**
  - **Acceptance Offer (firm offer):** An offer with no additional conditions.
  - **Conditional Offer:** An offer that requires you to fulfil specific conditions before enrolment (e.g., obtaining a final transcript, meeting the English language requirement). You must satisfy all conditions by the specified deadline.
- **Notification:** All applicants will be notified of their application result via email by late June. During the review period, applicants should stay patient. The University does not provide status updates on applications, nor provide reasons for unsuccessful applications.
- **Acceptance:** To accept an offer, you must confirm your acceptance and pay the required deposit by the deadline stated in your offer letter.

The admission process is highly competitive and the University's decision is final.

## 4.5 Student Visa Applications

- Non-local students (those requiring a student visa to study in Hong Kong) must apply for a student visa/entry permit through the Hong Kong Immigration Department.
- Upon accepting your offer, the University will provide you with the necessary documents and guidance to support your visa application. It is the applicant's responsibility to apply for the visa in a timely manner.
- The visa application process can take 8-10 weeks. Please apply as early as possible.
- Important Note: The visa/entry permit arrangement for study does not apply to nationals of Afghanistan, Cuba, Laos, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Nepal, and Vietnam. Applications from these regions will be automatically disqualified, and application fees will not be refunded.

## Chapter 5: Admissions Policies

---

### 5.1 Selection Criteria

Selection is based on a holistic review of the applicant's profile, including but not limited to:

- Academic performance and qualifications.
- Relevance of prior studies and experience.
- Quality of research proposal (for RPGs) and personal statement.
- Performance in the interview.
- Language proficiency.
- References and other supporting documents.

### 5.2 Applicants with Disabilities / SEN

HKSU is committed to equal opportunity in education. Applicants with disabilities or Special Educational Needs (SEN) are welcome to apply. We encourage you to disclose your condition during the application process so that the University can assess and provide appropriate support.

### 5.3 Concurrent Enrolment

Students are generally not permitted to be concurrently enrolled in another full-time / part-time award-bearing programme at HKSU or any other institution without prior approval from the Graduate School.

### 5.4 Credit Transfer and Exemption

Applicants with prior relevant postgraduate-level studies may apply for credit transfer or exemption. Approval is subject to the University's regulations and is not guaranteed. Applications must be submitted with official transcripts and detailed course syllabi.

### 5.5 Pre-admission & Bridging Courses

Some programmes may require admitted students to complete pre-admission or bridging courses to ensure they possess the foundational knowledge

required for the programme. You will be notified of such requirements in your offer letter. Failure of passing the pre-admission courses may result in disqualification.

## 5.6 Non-local Applicants

HKSU welcomes applications from quality candidates from around the world. For admission purposes, you are regarded as a "non-local student" if you hold a:

- Student visa/entry permit;
- Visa under the Immigration Arrangements for Non-local Graduates (IANG); or
- Dependant visa/entry permit (if you were 18 or above when it was issued).

All non-local students must obtain a valid student visa to study in Hong Kong. You cannot register or commence studies with a visitor or tourist visa. Do not travel to Hong Kong without a valid student visa.

Upon receiving an offer, HKSU will provide visa application details and relevant assistance. Processing can take at least 6 weeks (longer in summer), so you should apply immediately after receiving an offer. Note that the Immigration Department may not accept visa applications from certain nationals.

Non-local students are not eligible for HKSAR Government grants and loans and must ensure they have sufficient funds for all expenses (including tuition fee, accommodation and living cost, and personal medical insurance).

According to Hong Kong immigration policy, full-time non-local students can take up internships, part-time on-campus jobs, and summer work. However, research students receiving a studentship must seek prior approval for any employment.

## 5.7 Teaching Arrangements

Programmes are delivered primarily through face-to-face teaching on the

HKSU campus. The University reserves the right to alter the mode of delivery if necessary.

### **5.8 Declaration of Criminal Records**

Applicants may be required to declare any criminal convictions for specific programmes, especially those involving work with vulnerable groups. Failure to disclose relevant information may lead to the revocation of an offer or enrolment.

## Chapter 6: Admissions and Administrative Fees

### 6.1 Fees Structure (2026-27 Entry)

The tuition fees (in HKD) for postgraduate programmes are structured by study mode (full-time/part-time) and student status (local/non-local). The following table provides a detailed breakdown of the total tuition fees, per-credit costs (cr), and the first installment amount for each programme.

### Important Notes on Fees Payment:

- **Pre-Admission / Bridging Courses:** Some programmes require students to complete bridging courses. The non-refundable and non-transferable fee for these courses must be paid together with the first tuition fee installment. For details, please refer to the official fee document.
- **Payment Structure:**
  - For the MSc in Marketing and Consumer Psychology and MPhil/PhD programmes, the annual tuition fee is paid in two equal installments.
  - For all other taught postgraduate programmes, tuition fees are calculated based on the number of credits taken each semester. The "First Installment" shown is the fee for the initial set of credits.
- **Application Fee:** The non-refundable and non-transferrable application fee is HK\$250 for local applicants and HK\$650 for non-local applicants.

- **Enrolment Deposit:** All deposit fees paid are non-refundable and non-transferable, except under exceptional circumstances and with the approval of the Admissions Office.
- **Other Fees:** It may include an indemnity deposit (refundable), visa application fee, and graduation fee.

\*All fees are indicative for the 2026/27 academic year and are subject to annual review and change.\*

## 6.2 Fees Payment Methods

### Payment Methods:

Application Fees can be paid online through the Postgraduate Admissions System using the following methods:

- WeChat Pay (微信支付)
- Alipay (內地版支付宝)
- FPS (轉數快)
- Credit Card (Visa/Mastercard)

For enrolment deposit and tuition fee payment, please refer to the Registration Procedure and other instructions stipulated in the offer letter.

## 6.3 Fees Policies

- **Non-refundable and Non-transferable:** All fees paid, including the application fee and tuition deposit, are non-refundable and non-transferable under any circumstances, including if the application is unsuccessful, the applicant decides not to enrol, or the visa application is denied.
- **No Additional Payments:** Apart from the stipulated fees paid to the University, no additional payments are to be made to any individual staff member or unit. Offering any advantage (bribe) in connection with an application is a serious criminal offence under Hong Kong's *Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (Cap. 201)*.

## Chapter 7: Study at HKSU

---

### 7.1 Financial Assistance

- **Research Postgraduate Students:** Full-time MPhil/PhD students are normally provided with a Postgraduate Studentship, which is a financial award to support their studies.
- **Non-local Taught Postgraduate Students:** Are generally not eligible for Hong Kong government financial assistance. They are encouraged to seek funding from their home countries.
- **Scholarships:** A limited number of entrance scholarships may be available for outstanding students. Information will be provided upon admission.

### 7.2 Accommodation

- The University does not guarantee hostel accommodation for postgraduate students.
- Places in student hostels are limited and are allocated on a competitive basis. Students must apply separately for hostel placement.
- Most postgraduate students arrange for off-campus housing in private apartments. The University's Student Affairs Office and the Hall Management Unit can provide some information and resources to assist students in their search for accommodation.
